Volunteering Youth Led Grants offering up to £1,500

Deadline extended to 12pm, this Friday, 11 September 2020...so don't miss out!

The aim of this funding is to help young people to volunteer aged 14 - 25 to be more involved in community and voluntary organisations in their local community. The maximum grant you can apply for is up to £1,500. Find out more details and download application form

Third Sector Resilience Fund for Wales – Phase 2 – New Support

Changes to offer new funding to provide survival and recovery support for voluntary organisations in Wales during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Since April 2020, the Third Sector Resilience Fund for Wales has been providing support to help organisations through the pandemic, but as time moves on it is appropriate for this to enter a new phase. The fund will expand its range of support, whilst still making available survival funding for those who need it.

To assist recovery and to help organisations become more truly resilient for the future WCVA is adding two new strands.

The fund is part of the <u>£24m of support announced by Welsh Government</u> and will involve a blend of 75% grant and 25% initially interest free loan to be available to voluntary sector organisations towards the costs of ongoing revenue expenditure, including salaries.

Organisations can apply for up to £100,000. The fund is split into three strands; Survive, Improve and Diversify. WCVA is very much open to organisations looking to collaborate or work in partnership with other organisations to apply under the Improve and Diversify strands.

Voluntary Services Recovery Fund now open

A new fund from Welsh Government and administered by WCVA will focus on reducing the inequality resulting from the pandemic. Grants will support not for profit organisations working at a community scale up to a national level in Wales and can be between £10,000 - £100,000.

Lloyds Bank Foundation support charities with an annual income of £25,000 to £1 million. They offer a two year unrestricted grant of £50,000 alongside a Development Partner to help your charity navigate change. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

Comic Relief – Change Makers

Deadline extended to 12 noon, 25 September 2020

Grants are available for organisations that will make a significant contribution to their sector. Funding is available for three to five years and will fund investments from $\pounds150,000$ to $\pounds600,000$. Read more and find out how to apply

The Fat Beehive Foundation

Up to £2,500 is available for websites and digital products to other small UK registered charities. The Foundation's aim is to help these organisations carry out their work in a more efficient and effective way, resulting in positive social benefit. They only fund charities with an average income of less than £1 million a year. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

Consortium – LGBT+ Futures: National Emergencies Trust Fund

Thanks to the National Emergencies Trust, a total funding pot of £350,000 is available to address the additional needs of LGBT+ people and communities most adversely impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

The Fore's RAFT Transition Fund

In Autumn 2020, unrestricted grants of up to £15,000 will be available to help small charities and social enterprises plan for the longer term in a post-coronavirus world. Funding will enable grantees to strengthen their organisations, plan ahead, become more sustainable and refocus on the new needs of their beneficiaries. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

Warburton's Community Grants

Funding is available to support charitable organisations that require small grants (up to £250) to help them deliver a broader activity. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

Tudor Trust still open for non-emergency applications

The Tudor Trust is still open for non-emergency applications from organisations they are not currently supporting. Their trustees want to provide support to voluntary and community groups in the medium term, beyond this first emergency phase, as they focus on how they might carry their work forward. <u>Read more and find out how to apply</u>

Screwfix Foundation funding up to £5,000 for local registered charities and not for profit organisations

For community buildings and halls, funding is available for projects that will fix, maintain, improve and repair charitable and community facilities for those in need by reason of financial hardship, sickness, disability, distress or other disadvantage in the UK are eligible to apply. Tesco Bags for Help want to get their funds out quickly!

Tesco Bags of Help has responded to the current COVID-19 crisis by setting up a new fund to support local communities. In order respond quickly to the emergency they have created a streamlined application and payment process to make it easier to get funds out quickly. 
