Helen Boucher has supported clients through telephone befriending since April 2020, Helen has been that constant contact with her clients identifying when there were issues and feeding that back. Helen has volunteered over 100 hours



Stacey Vincent has provided shopping for those clients that were shielding, self-isolating or worried to go out. Stacey works full time and still found time to support those most vulnerable in the community by being a community resilience volunteer. Stacey has been a life line for those desperate for support with over 200 hours of volunteer support



Catrin Phillips volunteered at the start of the pandemic telephone befriending clients who would not speak to another person for a conversation. Since then Catrin has organised her community of Coity into gathering over 27 sensory boxes for Age Connects Morgannwg's Christmas 2020 appeal and has since applied for funding which was successful to help our volunteer supporting clients in the community to continue

Mr John Spanswick. After contracting COVID-19 where he was hospitalised in intensive care in December 2020, John wanted to help others in getting their vaccination so they didn't end up as seriously ill as he was. He volunteered in our transport to vaccination centre, supporting more that 10 people driving over 350 miles. John has also volunteered providing shopping for those clients that were shielding, selfisolating or worried to go out. John was able to identify issues or struggles people faces and fed that back to us for extra support where needed with over 30 hours of community resilience support



Mr Brian Jones has volunteered driving clients to vaccination centre's to ensure they are protected from COVID 19- without his support may clients would not be able to receive the vaccine. Brian has supported over 10 people driving 400 miles. Brian has also taken on regular weekly shopping calls. The clients were struggling to get to the shops and after hospital admission following a fall Brian has been supporting them.
