Closing date: 23:59, 31 August 2021.

A grant funding programme £5,000 – £49,000 to help communities living within five miles of certain waste transfer stations or landfill sites take action for their local environment.

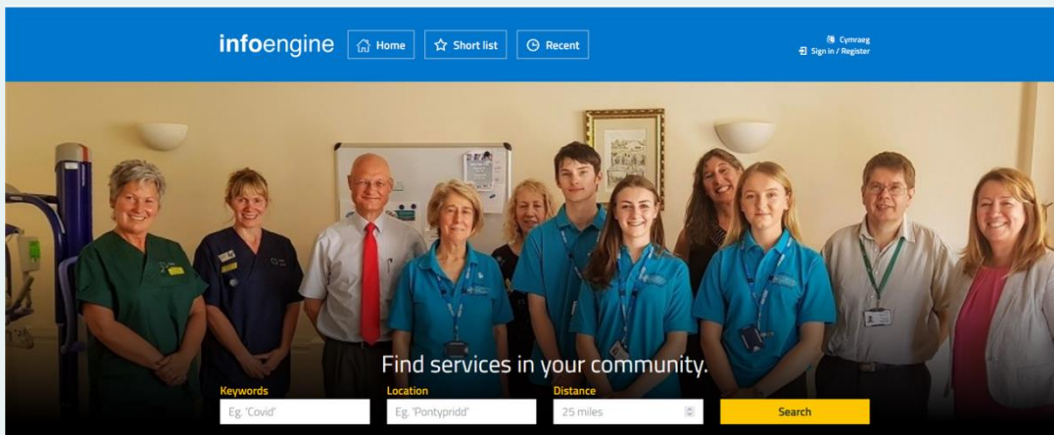
